When Tracy Ogali's much-loved husband of eleven years, Hratch, died suddenly at the young age of sixty, she found herself with three young children who needed her to be strong, but also to help them to come to terms with his death. Moved by their struggle to make sense of such searing loss, Tracy has created an enchanting story about life, death and how to deal with it. Written in verse form for children aged ten and upwards, **Afterlife** explores the harsh realities of life that can effect us all, at any time and any age.

What makes **Afterlife** truly special, is its vibrant, life-affirming artwork, which has been designed by Tracy's son Kane and his fellow GSCE art students at Chestnut Grove Academy in Balham, South London.

Countless young people experience loss -whether through death, divorce or ill health, involving parents, friends, grandparents and even their pets- and **Afterlife** communicates important themes of compassion, patience and perseverance to help nurture and shepherd them through these tough times.
